- ✖ Area: 78,866 sq km
- ✖ Population: 10.4 million (2012)
- ✖ Capital: Prague
- ✖ The Czech Republic is situated in the centre of Europe.
- ✖ The area is called Central Europe. Sometimes it is called the heart of Europe.

THE CZECH REPUBLIC

- ✖ The Czech Republic was created (founded) in 1993 on 1st January 1993.
- ✖ Before that it used to be Czechoslovakia.
- ✖ Today there are two independent countries, the Czech Republic and the Slovak Republic.
- ✖ The Czech Republic shares borders with Germany in the west and in the north, Poland in the north, Slovakia in the east and Austria in the south.

THE CZECH REPUBLIC

- ✖ The Czech republic is an inland country and it has no access to the sea.
- ✖ The area of the Czech Republic is about 79 000 square kilometres.
- ✖ Historically, the Czech republic is divided into three historical countries: Bohemia, Moravia and Silesia.

PRAGUE

- ✖ The capital city of the Czech republic is Prague.
- ✖ The population of Prague is 1.3 million people.
- ✖ Prague is situated in the middle of the Czech republic.
- ✖ Prague lies on the Vltava river.
- ✖ It is the seat of the president of the Czech Republic, the government, the parliament and other institutions.

OTHER CITIES

- ✖ Other big cities include: Brno, the second largest city, Ostrava the third largest city, Plzeň, Hradec Králové or the city of České Budějovice – situated in the south of the Czech republic on the Vltava river.
- ✖ Other historical towns include Český Krumlov, Telč, Slavonice, Tábor, Litomyšl.
- ✖ Spa towns include Karlovy Vary, Mariánské lázně, Jeseník, etc.

COUNTRYSIDE

- ✖ In the Czech Republic the countryside is varied.
- ✖ There are mountains, highlands, lowlands, sometimes the countryside is flat open farmland.
- ✖ In South Bohemia the countryside is quite hilly, but there are some mountains and lowlands too.
- ✖ There are a lot of lakes and rivers.

MOUNTAINS

- ✖ Speaking about mountains, mountains are situated mostly along the border of the Czech Republic.
- ✖ People like to go skiing in the Krkonoše Mountains.
- ✖ There is the highest mountain of the Czech Republic, Sněžka (1,602 m above the sea level).

MOUNTAINS

- ✖ The other mountains are the Šumava mountains (people like to go hiking and biking there), the Orlické mountains in the north, the Beskydy mountains in the east.
- ✖ There are not high mountains in the south, only the Novohradské mountains on the border with Austria.
- ✖ Then there is the Czech-Moravian Highlands.

RIVERS

- ✖ Speaking about rivers, the longest river in the Czech Republic is the Vltava river (430 km).
- ✖ It flows from the south through the city of České Budějovice and the capital of Prague and it enters the Elbe (Labe) river.
- ✖ The other rivers include the Orlice river, the Lužnice river in the south, the Morava river, etc.

CLIMATE

- ✖ The climate in the Czech Republic is mild.
- ✖ Summers are quite warm and winters are cold with snow.
- ✖ In the city of České Budějovice it does´t snow very often.
- ✖ Most of time the weather is quite changeable, sometimes very difficult to forecast.

POLITICAL SYSTEM

- ✖ The Czech Republic is a parliamentary democracy with two houses: The Chamber of Deputies (200 Members of Parliament) and the Senate (81 Senators).
- ✖ The president is the head of state and is responsible for appointing the prime minister, who is the head of government.
- ✖ The president serves a five-year term.

TOURISM

- ✖ The Czech Republic is one of the most visited countries in Europe.
- ✖ The tourists from all over the world appreciate the fact that there are a lot of sights and places of interest.
- ✖ The Czech Republic is also rich in history, culture, nature and entertainment.

TOURISM

- ✖ The Czech Republic is visited by the tourists from all over the world, mainly from: Germany, Austria, Slovakia, Russia (the centre of the Russian community is the city Karlovy Vary), Holland (The Dutch people love South Bohemia, at Lipno lake there is a big Dutch community), Japan, Great Britain and the USA.

TOURISM

- ✖ When tourists come to the Czech Republic they always go to Prague, they spend a few days there and then they follow down to Karlštejn Castle, then they visit Hluboká Castle or Český Krumlov and other places.
- ✖ Tourists also like going to spas. The most favourite spas with tourists are Karlovy Vary, Mariánské Spa, Františkovi Spa, Třeboň Spa, Jeseníky Spa or Luhačovice Spa.

ECONOMY

- ✖ The Czech economy is primarily export-based.
- ✖ Industries include automotive, glass and ceramic production, metal and electronics.
- ✖ Its main agricultural products are potatoes, wheat and hops.
- ✖ Its economy is closely connected with Germany and other EU countries.
